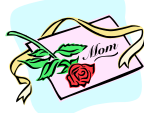

Relay For Life



Relay For Life is the American Cancer Society's signature activity. It offers everyone in a community an opportunity to participate in the fight against cancer. Teams of people camp out at a local high school, park, or fairground and take turns walking or running around a track or path. Each team is asked to have a representative on the track at all times during the event. Relays are an overnight event, up to 24 hours in length.

Relay For Life is a life-changing event that brings together more than 3.5 million people to:

Celebrate the lives of those who have battled cancer. The strength of survivors inspires others to continue to fight. Remember loved ones lost to the disease. At Relay, people who have walked alongside people battling cancer can grieve and find healing.

Fight Back. We Relay because we have been touched by cancer and desperately want to put an end to the disease.

New Web Pay Statement Available

In the ongoing effort to better serve employees, a new, Web pay statement is available to all Johns Hopkins employees (excluding APL and Howard County General Hospital) regardless of whether you receive your pay by check or direct deposit. The Web pay statement is easy to read and features detailed information that cannot be included on a paper pay stub or on the former Web pay stub for JHU faculty, staff and students. For example, if you receive a retroactive pay increase, the amount per pay period is presented.

You also may choose to have an e-mail sent to you when a new Web pay statement is available, which will usually be the day before pay day. The schedule is:

- April 10 – first weekly Web pay statements
- April 15 – first semimonthly Web pay statements
- April 17 – first biweekly Web pay statements

By April 30, pay statements for all pay in 2009 will be available. The Web site with an explanation of the new pay statement and access to the new Web pay statement may be found at http://ssc.jhmi.edu/payroll/Web_Pay_Stub.html.

The Web pay statement can be directly accessed using myJH at my.jhmi.edu. Look for the “myPay” icon.

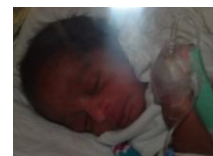
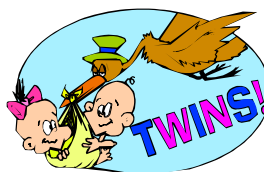
Staff News
